		<p>The resources tackle ethical questions about farming animals. At present some of the CIWF resources promote 'organic' animal production systems as superior in terms of animal welfare. This is not necessarily the case in Australian farming due to different organic accreditation systems, and to the general differences between Australian and European farming systems (eg much less animal shedding in Australia). Care needs to be taken by teachers using this resource in terms of student sensitivity and accuracy of information.
